



- a common proper name
- one or more elements of common culture which need not be specified, but may include religion, customs, or language
- unique community of interests, feelings and actions
- a shared sense of common origins or ancestry, and
- a common geographic origin.

These coding guidelines are given to ensure consistency between collections. There are a number of ethnic groups that are multipleworded responses but are one ethnic group. Some common examples are given here.



Principles for the review



- Ethnicity is a measure of cultural affiliation, self-perceived and selfidentified
- Respondents can have multiple ethnicities
- Enable data to be collected with enough detail to meet user needs
- Be inclusive and provide visibility for communities and individuals to understand where they are in the data
